AN ACT Authorizing Appeals by State in Criminal Proceedings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 15, § 2118, additional. Title 15 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2118, to read as follows:

‘§ 2118. Appeals by State

Appeals from the rulings and decisions of any Judge of a District Court, a Justice of the Superior Court or a single Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court may be taken by the State to the Supreme Judicial Court upon any question of law arising in a criminal case, in the same manner as if made by the accused.’
