STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Out-of-State Service Credit for Teachers Under State Retirement System.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., T. 5, § 1094, sub-§ 12, ¶ A, sub-¶ (5), additional. Paragraph A of sub-section 12 of section 1094 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new subparagraph (5) to read as follows :

‘(5) Any public school teacher who leaves service in Maine to teach children of United States occupational forces, located in any foreign country on a regularly established United States military base, shall be allowed credit for such service, not to exceed 2 years, provided such teacher returned to active teaching service in Maine within one year of the completion of such foreign service, and pays into the Maine State Retirement System contributions as would have been made had the service been rendered in Maine.’
