SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 788, L. D. 931, Bill, "An Act

Relating to State Retirement Benefits for Certain Teachers."

Amend said Bill, in the Title, by adding after the word "Teachers" the words 'and Increasing Pensions for Certain Retired School Superintendents'

Further amend said Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

"Sec. 1. R. S., T. 5. Sec. 1121, sub-sec. 2, Par.G, additional. Subsection 2 of section 1121 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new paragraph G to read as follows:

'G. Paragraph C shall apply to all superintendents employed in public school who have been retired under an order issued by the Governor and Council and are now receiving benefits, providing such benefits are less than those authorized by said paragraph C.'

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 5. Sec. 1121, sub-sec. 5, amended. The first sentence of subsection 5 of section 1121 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows: 'Any teacher who began to teach in the public schools of Maine prior to July 1, 1947 and has attained 60 years of age shall, upon proper application and verification of at least 15 years of such teaching service, be granted a minimum monthly benefit of -25 \$40.'

Sec. 3. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Maine State Retirement System the sum of \$31,250 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 and the sum of \$37,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1967 to carry out the purposes of this Act.

Sec. 4. Effective date. The minimum amount provided by this Act shall become effective on the first day of the month following the effective date of this Act and proper adjustments in benefits already being paid shall be made to those persons affected on their first monthly pension paid subsequent to said effective date."
