STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Wearing Fluorescent Clothing When Hunting.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., T. 12, § 2468, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2468, to read as follows :

‘§ 2468. Fluorescent clothing

Whoever, in that part of the State which is open to deer hunting with firearms, hunts or traps, except when hunting waterfowl from a boat or blind, shall wear fluorescent, red or orange clothing or fluorescent material which is visible from all sides. The failure of any person shot or wounded to wear fluorescent clothing shall not be a defense in any criminal action based on negligent shooting nor shall it be received as evidence of contributory negligence in any civil action based on negligent shooting.’
