STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to the Sale of Fireworks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 8, § 211, amended. The first sentence of section 211 of Title 8 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'No person shall sell, or keep or offer for sale, or use, explode or cause to explode any combustible or explosive composition or substance, or any combination of such compositions or substances, or any other article, which was prepared for the purpose of producing a visible or audible effect by combustion, explosion, deflagration or detonation, including in the above terms blank cartridges or toy cannons in which explosives are used, the type of balloon which requires fire underneath to propel the same, fire crackers, torpedoes, skyrockets, roman candles, bombs, sparklers, rockets, wheels, colored fires, fountains, mines, serpents, or other fireworks of like construction, or any fireworks containing any explosive or flammable compound, or any tablets or other device containing any explosive substance or flammable compound except for those fireworks described as "Class C Fireworks" by the Federal Interstate Commerce Commission which may be offered for sale from June 20th to July 5th for use only on July 4th.'
