AN ACT Relating to Display of Flashlights by Pedestrians on Ways After Dark.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 905, additional. Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 905 to read as follows:

‘§ 905. After dark

Any pedestrian walking along and upon a highway shall, during the period from $\frac{1}{2}$ hour after sunset to $\frac{1}{2}$ hour before sunrise, display a lighted flashlight so as to give notice of his presence to oncoming vehicular traffic.’
