STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Place of Keeping Records of Liquor Licensees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 351, amended. The first sentence of section 351 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

Every retail licensee shall keep for 2 years, in for each premise for which he has a license, at such place as he designated in his license application, complete records separate and apart from records relating to any other transactions engaged in by the licensee showing the date of all purchases, the actual prices paid therefor and the fact that the licensee paid cash for all liquor bought by him at the time of or prior to delivery of such liquor together with the name and address of every person from whom such liquor was purchased.'
