STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Disposal of Dangerous Buildings in Municipalities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 2851, amended. The first sentence of section 2851 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'When the municipal officers of a town municipality, after personal notice in writing to the owner or part owner of any burnt dilapidated or dangerous building, or any building which constitutes a hazard to safety or health or public welfare by reason of inadequate maintenance, dilapidation, obsolescence, abandonment or unfitness for human habitation and which exerts a downgrading or blighting influence on the surrounding neighborhood, or by publication in a newspaper in the same county, if any, 3 weeks successively, otherwise in the state paper, and after a hearing of the matter, adjudge the same to be a nuisance or dangerous, they may make and record an order prescribing what disposal shall be made thereof, and thereupon the town municipal clerk shall deliver a copy of such order to a constable, who shall serve such owner or part owner. if a resident of the State, with an attested copy thereof, and make return of his doings thereon to said clerk forthwith.'
