STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Schooling of Children on Indian Reservations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. I. R. S., T. 20, § 1452, amended. Section 1452 of Title 20 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

[§] 1452. Children living on Indian reservations

Non Indian All children ehildren with less than 1/4 part of Indian blood who reside with parent or guardian on an Indian reservation shall be entitled to school privileges as described in sections 1453 and 1454, notwithstanding that these children do not reside in unorganized territory.'

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 22, § 4774, repealed. Section 4774 of Title 22 of the Revised Statutes is repealed.

Sec. 3. R. S., T. 22, § 4838, repealed. Section 4838 of Title 22 of the Revised Statutes is repealed.

Sec. 4. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Health and Welfare the sum of \$19,577 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 and the sum of \$19,617 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1967. The breakdown shall be as follows:
