AN ACT Relating to Settlements of Paupers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 22, § 4451, sub-§ 8, additional. Section 4451 of Title 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new subsection 8, to read as follows:

'8. State paupers. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a person who remains on the pauper list so-called for a period of 6 months shall be deemed to have no settlement in the State. If such person does not receive supplies as a pauper, directly or indirectly, for a period of 6 months after he is deemed to have no settlement in the State, then the State's responsibility shall cease.'
