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### **AN ACT Relating to Inmates at Reformatories Attending Funerals.**

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

**Sec. 1. R. S., T. 34, § 809, additional.** Title 34 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 809 to read as follows :

**‘§ 809. Attendance at funerals**

**An inmate of the Reformatory for Men, at the disccrttion of the superintendent, may attend the funeral of his legally considered mother, father, wife, son or daughter if the funeral is held within the State of Maine. The inmate, if able, shall pay the cost of transportation and the salary of the accompanying officer.’**

**Sec. 2. R. S., T. 34, § 863, additional.** Title 34 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 863 to read as follows :

**‘§ 863. Attendance at funerals**

**An inmate of the Reformatory for Women, at the discretion of the superintendent, may attend the funeral of her legally considered mother, father, husband, son or daughter if the funeral is held within the State of Maine. The inmate, if able, shall pay the cost of transportation and the salary of the accompanying officer.’**
