AN ACT Relating to Visiting Traps Under Fish and Game Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., T. 12, § 2351, amended. The first sentence of section 2351 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows :

‘Any person trapping in any organized or incorporated place shall visit each trap or cause the same to be visited at least once in every calendar day including Sunday, except **land sets, so-called, elevated 4 feet or more above the ground,** beaver sets, so-called **and those water sets, so-called, situated in organized territory,** and remove therefrom or cause to be removed any animal found caught therein.’
