## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Practical Demonstrations Without Fee in Schools of Hairdressing and Beauty Culture.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 32, § 1553, amended. Section 1553 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended by inserting after the first sentence, 2 new sentences, as follows:

'Practical demonstrations will include supervised practice which shall consist of rendering service to persons other than fellow students, but such practice shall be of a clinical nature and under the direct supervision of a duly licensed instructor. No such school, nor any student registered therein nor any other person shall charge, either directly or indirectly, or receive any fee or gratuity for any services rendered, and shall furnish without charge or fee, either directly or indirectly, all supplies used on any person acting as a subject for student instruction and training.'
