STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Authorizing Qualified Licenses After Conviction for Drunken Driving if Essential to Livelihood.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 1312, amended. Section 1312 of Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read as follows:

'Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the Secretary of State may, when he is satisfied, after investigation, that the revocation of the license of any person convicted of violating this section seriously and substantially impairs his means of livelihood, issue a qualified license to such person so as to permit the operation of a specified vehicle by him during the hours of his employment.'
