STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Drinking in Unlicensed Public Places.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., T. 17, § 2003, sub-§ 2, amended. Subsection 2 of section 2003 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- '2. Public place defined. "Public place" as used in this section shall mean to keep, maintain or lease any premises for the drinking of any liquor by the public or other persons unless the premises are licensed by the State Liquor Commission, and any common carrier, dance, entertainment, amusement or sport or grounds adjacent thereto and used in conjunction therewith or any highway, street or lane, to which the public is invited or has access.'
