AN ACT Relating to Production Quotas for Debit Insurance Agents.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 24, § 2906-A, additional. Title 24 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2906-A, to read as follows:

‘§ 2906-A. Production quotas

No insurance company subject to this Title, which employs insurance agents whose duties include the collection of monthly or weekly premium, shall establish or enforce any quota for the production of new business, whether said quota shall be in terms of dollar amounts, relative standing, percentage increase or any other basis or standard; nor shall any such company terminate or threaten or attempt to terminate the employment or license of any agent for failure to attain any such quota.

Upon complaint of any agent that his employment has been threatened or terminated in violation of this section, the Insurance Commissioner shall hold hearings in accordance with this chapter, and shall be empowered to require such action as he may deem fitting or appropriate and just, including but not limited to reinstatement of the agent with full back pay and injunction against the enforcement and establishment of any quota, should he find a violation of this section.’
