HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 845, L.D. 1146, Bill, "An Act
Relating to Construction and Operation of Intrastate Natural Gas
Pipelines."

Amend said Bill by striking out all of section 2 and insert-
ing in place thereof the following:

"Sec. 2. R. S., T. 35, §2535, amended. The last sentence of
section 2535 of Title 35 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and
the following enacted in place thereof:
'Such pipeline or pipelines may be constructed and located within,
over, along or under the location of any railroad or other public
utility or ways constructed by the Maine Turnpike Authority, and
rights-of-way under the jurisdiction of said turnpike authority.
Such construction and location may be by agreement with such rail-
road, or other public utility or turnpike authority, or in the event
of failure so to agree then with the approval of the Public Utilities
Commission and in such place and manner and under such conditions
and upon payment of such reasonable compensation as may be deter-
mined by said commission, and all work on the property of such rail-
road, public utility or right-of-way or ways therein, shall be done
under the supervision and to the satisfaction of such railroad,
public utility or turnpike authority, but at the expense of such
corporation. Any railroad or other public utility or the Maine
Turnpike Authority aggrieved by the the decision or judgment of the
Public Utilities Commission may appeal to the Superior Court in the
county where the property is situated, within 30 days from the time
when the report of the commission is made. If the decision or
judgment of the commission is upheld, the appellee shall recover
the costs from the time of appeal, otherwise the owner shall
recover costs. The appellant shall, when such appeal is taken,
include in the complaint a statement setting forth substantially
the facts of the case and shall give written notice of such appeal
with a copy of the complaint to the opposite party. An appeal
may be taken to the law court as in other actions.' "
