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### AN ACT Relating to Insurance on Public Buildings.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Sec. 1. R. S., T. 5, § 1701, amended.** Section 1701 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

**‘§ 1701. Authorization; deposit of policies**

All fire and liability insurance placed upon public buildings and other property belonging to the State shall be placed thereon by the several heads of departments having said property in charge, subject to the approval of the Governor and Council, or authorized by the Governor and Council, and all expense therefor shall be paid from the several departmental appropriations for insurance on said property. The policies for all insurance so placed shall be deposited with the Insurance Commissioner, and a record thereof kept by the Governor and Council and said commissioner.’

**Sec. 2. R. S., T. 5, § 1702, amended.** Section 1702 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

**‘§ 1702. Insurance money available for replacement**

Whenever any officer or department of the State the Governor and Council has taken out authorized and there is fire insurance taken out on property owned by the State, or for which the State is responsible, and the property has been destroyed, the money paid by the insurance companies on the loss shall, with the approval of the Governor and Council, be made immediately available for the use of such the appropriate office or department in replacing the destroyed property, or otherwise, as may be needed in the work of the office or department.’
