AN ACT Clarifying the Offenses of Procuring Liquor for Certain Persons.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 1058, amended. Section 1058 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

§ 1058. Furnishing liquor to certain persons prohibited

Whoever knowingly procures or in any way aids or assists in procuring liquor or whoever furnishes, gives or delivers liquor to a minor who may not legally purchase liquor for himself or for any intoxicated person, pauper, mentally ill person or person of known intemperate habits, except that this provision shall not apply to liquor served to a minor in the home **in the presence of a parent or guardian**, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200 or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months, or by both.'
