AN ACT Relating to Definition of Hotel Under Liquor Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 28, § 2, sub-§ 9, amended. The first sentence of subsection 9 of section 2 of Title 28 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

“Hotel” shall mean any reputable place operated by responsible persons of good reputation, where the public, for a consideration, obtains sleeping accommodations and meals under one roof and which has a public dining room or rooms **either** operated by the same management **or by a lessee** open and serving food during the morning, afternoon and evening, and a kitchen, apart from the public dining room or rooms, in which food is regularly prepared for the public on the same premises.’
