STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Weight and Number of Salmon and Trout Taken from Sebago Lake, Cumberland County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 12, § 2553, amended. The first sentence of the first paragraph of section 2553 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'No person shall take, catch, kill or have in possession more than 12 fish of the salmon, trout, togue or black bass species during any one day of any open season, from any or all of the inland waters of the State, including salmon and trout taken from Sebago Lake, Cumberland County, except in the County of Aroostook and except as provided for by rules and regulations of the department under section 1960.'

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 12, § 2553, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 2553 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'No person shall take, catch or kill in any one day or have in possession at any time more than $7\frac{1}{2}$ pounds in the aggregate of the trout, salmon, togue and black bass species, including salmon and trout taken from Sebago Lake, Cumberland County, unless the last fish caught increases the combined weight to more than $7\frac{1}{2}$ pounds.'
