AN ACT Establishing Raymond Cape as Game Preserve.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2101, amended. Section 2101 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended by inserting after the 32nd paragraph, which relates to Rangeley Lake Sanctuary, the following new paragraph:

'Raymond Cape Game Preserve: No person shall at any time, trap, hunt, pursue, shoot at or kill any wild animal or any game or other wild life or birds in Raymond Cape, so-called, in the Town of Raymond, County of Cumberland, within the area enclosed by a boundary line drawn as follows: On the south by Panther Stream; on the east by Route 302; on the north by Thomas Pond Outlet and Dingley Brook and on the west and southwest by Sebago Lake. This paragraph shall not prohibit the commissioner (of Inland Fisheries and Game) from regulating the taking of fur-bearing animals therefrom. It shall be unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time any wild bird or wild animal taken in violation of any provision of this paragraph. Whoever violates any provision of this paragraph shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5 nor more than \$50.
