IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Trespass on Public Beaches and Shores.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 3853-A, additional. Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 3853-A, to read as follows:

‘§ 3853-A. Public beaches and shores

Whoever willfully permits his cattle, horses, sheep or swine to enter in and upon public beaches, shores or banks after having been forbidden to do so by an officer of the municipality or quasi-municipal corporation owning or operating said beach, shore or bank or by an appropriate notice posted conspicuously on said beach, shore or bank shall be guilty of trespass and shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both.’
