STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Intoxication on Premises Licensed to Sell Liquor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 2001, amended. The first sentence of section 2001 of Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

Whoever is found intoxicated in any premises licensed for the sale of intoxicating liquors, street, highway or other public place, or is found intoxicated in a motor vehicle while said motor vehicle is in any street, highway or other public place, shall be punished for the first offense by a fine of not more than \$20 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both, and upon any subsequent conviction by a fine of not more than \$60 or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both, except that in any county where a county farm for the reformation of inebriates has been established, any male person who has been previously convicted of intoxication may be sentenced to such farm for a period of not less than 90 days nor more than 11 months.'
