STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Expiration Date of Licenses for Eating Places.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after the adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, under the present law licenses for eating places expire June 30th following the issuance of said licenses; and

Whereas, in order to prevent undue hardships on such licenses, the following legislation is vitally necessary so that the licenses will continue for one year and prevent the purchase of several licenses in any one-year period; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 22, § 2484, amended. The last sentence of section 2484 of Title 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Each license shall expire on the 30th day of June next following one year from the date of the issuance and shall not be transferable.'

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
