# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

#### AN ACT Relating to the Operation of Watercraft and Water Skis.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., T. 38, § 237, sub-§ 1, amended. Subsection 1 of section 237 of Title 38 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end the following:
- 'No person shall water ski or surfboard between sunset and sunrise. No watercraft shall have more than 2 water skiers at any time, except during a regatta or water ski exhibition.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., T. 38, § 237, sub-§ 4, repealed and replaced. Subsection 4 of section 237 of Title 38 of the Revised Statutes is repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:
- '4. Prudent operation required. It is unlawful to operate any watercraft, except at a reasonable and prudent speed for the existing conditions. No person shall operate any watercraft within 500 feet of the shoreline, except for trolling for fish, when a distance of 300 feet shall be maintained from the shoreline, or for the purpose of approaching or leaving a dock, pier or wharf, or for passage through a thoroughfare or channel from one body of inland water to another.'
- Sec. 3. R. S., T. 38, § 237, sub-§ 6, amended. Subsection 6 of section 237 of Title 38 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end the following:
- 'No motorboat shall haul a water skier unless there are 2 persons in the motorboat over 16 years of age.'
- Sec. 4. R. S., T. 38, § 238, sub-§ 2, ¶ C, amended. Paragraph C of subsection 2 of section 238 of Title 38 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new paragraph to read as follows:

'The area used for a water ski exhibition shall be designated by warning flags and shall be located not less than 1,000 feet from the shoreline. The exhibition shall be publicly advertised in a newspaper having a general circulation in the county in which the exhibition is to be held at least once each week for 2 successive weeks prior to the event and shall be held between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m., Eastern Daylight Time.'

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
