STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Relating to Definition of Cord under Weights and Measures Law.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., T. 10, § 2302, sub-§ 1, amended. Subsection 1 of section 2302 of Title 10 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:
- '1. Cord. "Cord" when used in connection with pulpwood, slabs, edgings or wood intended for fuel purposes when the wood is ranked and well stowed, or with sawdust, shavings or chips, shall mean the amount of wood that is contained in a space of 128 cubic feet when the wood is ranked and well stowed and 1/2 of the kerf of the wood is included."
- Sec. 2. R. S., T. 10, § 2751, amended. The first paragraph of section 2751 of Title 10 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

'Any person who, by himself or by his servant or agent, or as the servant or agent of another person, performs any one of the acts enumerated in subsections I to I3 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon a first conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 and upon a second or subsequent conviction thereof, he shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200, except that for a violation of subsection 6, the penalty for a second or subsequent offense shall be a fine of not more than \$500.'
