IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Relating to Qualifications for Practice of Hairdressing and Beauty Culture.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 32, § 1652, amended. The first paragraph of section 1652 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

‘Any person shall be eligible to obtain a certificate of registration under this chapter for the practice of hairdressing and beauty culture as an operator.’

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 32, § 1652, sub-§ 5, additional. Section 1652 of Title 32 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new subsection 5, to read as follows:

‘5. **Supervision.** No operator shall operate or manage any shop or establishment where hairdressing and beauty culture are practiced unless such shop or establishment is supervised by a registered hairdresser.

All operators’ certificates shall expire June 30th and shall be renewed on or before July 1st for a fee of \$5 for each renewal. Application blanks for renewal shall be furnished by the board.

Each operator, after 12 months of practical shop experience, shall make written application on a form prescribed and supplied by said board. Said application shall contain satisfactory evidence of the qualifications required of the applicant under this chapter, and shall be sworn to by the applicant.

Said application shall be filed with the secretary of said board and shall be accompanied by a registration fee of \$10, whereupon a certificate as a registered hairdresser shall be issued. Said certificate shall be renewed under section 1655.’

Sec. 3. Effective date. This Act shall become effective July 1, 1966.
