# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-FIVE

AN ACT Appropriating Money to Match Federal Funds Provided Under the Manpower Development and Training Act of 1962.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Department of Education, Manpower Development and Training Act of 1962. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$57,600 to the Department of Education for the fiscal year 1966-67, to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

In order to continue to participate in programs under the Manpower Development and Training Act of 1962, as amended, the State Department of Education. Bureau of Vocational Education, is authorized to administer manpower development and training programs, to execute on behalf of this State agreements or contracts with the appropriate federal agencies containing such provisions as may be necessary or desirable to enable this State to participate in such programs, to expend all funds made available for the purpose of such programs by this State or local subdivisions thereof or by the Federal Government, to super-

vise the expenditure of such funds and the conduct of such programs by other public and private agencies in this State, and to make such reports and certifications as are called for, and otherwise to cooperate with the Federal Government and its departments and agencies in the administration of such programs.

The amended Manpower Development and Training Act will not require matching funds during the fiscal year 1965-66 but it will require 10% matching during the fiscal year 1966-67. The anticipated allotment for training programs is \$576,000. This Act provides for the necessary 10% (\$57,600) in matching funds.
