AN ACT Relating to Branding of Potatoes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows :

R. S., T. 7, § 952, amended. The first sentence of section 952 of Title 7 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 3 of chapter 219 of the public laws of 1965, is amended to read as follows :

'It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, association, organization or corporation, or agent, representative or assistant to any person, firm, association, organization or corporation to expose for sale, or sell, at wholesale or retail, to ship, deliver or consign or have in possession potatoes prepared for market unless in containers which have been legibly and conspicuously tagged, branded, labeled or stenciled with the name and address of the person or persons **responsible for packing and the name of the grade, net weight** and the word "potatoes."' '
