STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SIX

AN ACT to Provide Funds for the Maine State Guard.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to prevent undue turbulence in the Maine State Guard; and

Whereas, it is in the best interests of safety and interest of this State to encourage the further growth and expansion of the Maine State Guard during these perilous times; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Maine State Guard; appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Adjutant General's Department the sum of \$13,567 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1966 and the sum of \$7,550 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1967 for the operation of the Maine State Guard. This sum shall be expended in the following manner:
