STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SIX

RESOLVE, Authorizing Transfer of State Land to City of Augusta for Fire Station.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, there is serious need of a municipal fire station in Augusta in the vicinity of the Augusta State Hospital and other state buildings and other properties; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Governor; authorized to transfer land to City of Augusta. Resolved: the Governor is authorized and directed to transfer a parcel of land owned by the State in Augusta on the easterly side of Hospital Street with a frontage of about 300 feet on the street and a depth of about 250 feet to the City of Augusta to be used for a municipal fire station. In the event the city at any time ceases to use said land for said purposes, said parcel shall revert to the State of Maine.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Statement of Facts

There is serious need of a municipal fire station in Augusta in the vicinity of the Augusta State Hospital and other state buildings and other properties.
