**AN ACT Appropriating Funds for the Operation of the Maine Highway Safety
Committee.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, motor vehicle driver improvement programs are vital to prevent motor vehicle accidents on our highways; and

Whereas, such programs are the responsibility of the Highway Safety Committee; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to carry on such programs; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Highway Safety Committee the sum of \$14,175. This appropriation shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until June 30, 1967. The breakdown shall be as follows:

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
