# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SIX

AN ACT Amending the Allocations from the General Highway Fund for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1966 and June 30, 1967.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts and resolves passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, funds will be required to finance an accelerated driver improvement program, additional State Troopers, purchase of radar equipment, increases in employees' salaries, purchase of highway maintenance equipment, and construction of highway maintenance garage prior to the expiration of the 90-day period following the adjournment of the Special Session; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1965, c. 152, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 152 of the private and special laws of 1965 is amended by decreasing the amount allocated for Highway Construction—State-Federal, as follows:

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1965, c. 152, § 1, amended. Section 1 of chapter 152 of the private and special laws of 1965 is amended by allocating the following amounts, which are in addition to allocations contained in said section 1:

Sec. 3. P. & S. L., 1965, c. 152, § 4, amended. Section 4 of chapter 152 of the private and special laws of 1965 is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 4. Allocation of General Highway Fund. Receipts to the General Highway Fund for the next 2 fiscal years—from July 1, 1965 to June 30, 1966 and from July 1, 1966 to June 30, 1967—from the proceeds of the sale of bonds shall be segregated, apportioned and expended as designated in the following schedule and shall be in addition to the amounts allocated to the General Highway Fund from proceeds of the sale of bonds under Chapter 152, Private and Special Laws of 1965:
