**AN ACT Appropriating Moneys for Relocation and Conversion of Dispensary
at Maine Maritime Academy.**

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment of the Legislature unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the present dispensary at Maine Maritime Academy is in Dismukes Hall to be renovated in 1966; and

Whereas, original plans contemplated removal of the dispensary to Leavitt Hall, to be renovated in 1967; and

Whereas, since funds are not available to renovate Dismukes Hall and Leavitt Hall at the same time, it is desirable to house the dispensary in a cottage; and

Whereas, the following legislation is vitally necessary to convert the cottage for use as a dispensary and will permit creation of needed student dormitory rooms in Leavitt Hall; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Appropriation. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$8,430 to the Maine Maritime Academy for reloca-

tion and conversion of dispensary. The appropriation shall not lapse but shall remain a continuing carrying account until the purposes of this Act have been accomplished.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
