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**AN ACT Making Additional Appropriations for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1966 and June 30, 1967.**

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**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts and resolves passed by the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of State Government will become due and payable immediately; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**Sec. 1. Appropriations for necessary expenditures of government.** In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of government, the sum of \$610,795 is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the General Fund not otherwise appropriated. Upon receipt of allotments duly approved by the Governor and Council based upon work programs submitted to the State Budget Officer, the State Controller shall authorize expenditures of these appropriations and revenues accruing thereto, together with expenditures for other purposes necessary to the conduct of state government, on the basis of such allotments and not otherwise.

**Sec. 2. Chapter 200, P. & S. L., 1965.** The provisions of chapter 200 of the private and special laws of 1965, notwithstanding, the State Controller, with the approval of the Governor and Council, may increase the Allocations of the Liquor Commission to specifically cover those adjustments determined to be necessary as related to the Employees' Salary Plan.

**Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.
