**AN ACT Prohibiting the Hunting of Muskrat, Mink, Otter and Fisher with
Firearms or Bow and Arrow.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 12, § 2362, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new section 2362, to read as follows:

§ 2362. Hunting muskrat, mink, otter and fisher

It shall be unlawful to hunt muskrat, mink, otter or fisher with firearms or bow and arrow.

Sec. 2. R. S., T. 12, § 3060, sub-§ 1-A, additional. Section 3060 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 37 of chapter 448 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended by adding a new subsection 1-A, to read as follows:

1-A. Muskrat, mink, otter and fisher. Whoever violates section 2362 shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$50 and costs and \$50 additional for each muskrat, mink, otter or fisher skin involved, or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or by both.
