STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Increasing Salaries of Official Court Reporters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 4, § 651, amended. The first sentence of section 051 of Title 4 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 1 of chapter 512 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows:

The Chief Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court may appoint not more than 12 Official Court Reporters to serve for a term of 7 years, who shall report the proceedings in the Supreme Judicial Court and in the Superior Court and who shall be officials of the court to which they may from time to time be assigned by the Chief Justice, and be sworn to the faithful discharge of their duties, and each of whom shall receive from the State a salary of \$8,500 \$12,000 per year.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$31,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1968 and the sum of \$42,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969 to carry out the purposes of this Act. The breakdown shall be as follows:
