STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Harvesting of Shellfish in Surry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1959, c. 155, § 30-A, additional. Chapter 155 of the private and special laws of 1959 is amended by adding a new section 30-A, to read as follows:

Sec. 30-A. Taking of clams, quohogs and mussels in Surry. It shall be unlawful for any person to dig any clams, quohogs or mussels within the limits of the Town of Surry, Hancock County, except a resident of said town. No such resident shall dig more than $\frac{1}{2}$ bushel of clams, quohogs or mussels per person per tide within said town.
