# AN ACT Relating to Divorce Actions by Military Nonresidents Stationed in Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 19, § 691, amended.** Section 691 of Title 19 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end, a new paragraph, as follows:

Any person serving on active duty in a military branch of the United States and the spouse of any such person who is not previously a citizen of the State of Maine and who, at the time of filing a complaint for divorce, has been stationed at a military installation or installations or other place in this State for a period of 6 months next before the filing of such complaint, shall for the purposes hereof be deemed to be an actual bona fide inhabitant and resident respectively of the State of Maine and either the county in which the military installation or installations or other place at which he has been stationed is located or of the county in which he has resided.
