AN ACT Relating to Nomination of Primary Candidates at State Conventions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 21, § 403, additional. Title 21 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 403 to read as follows:

§ 403. Nominate primary candidates

The state convention of each political party may nominate candidates for the offices of United States Senate and Representatives to Congress, and state and county offices to be filled by the voters at the ensuing primary election. Candidates so nominated shall not be required to file a primary petition as provided in section 445.
