STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD XINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEX

AN ACT Relating to Driving Motor Vehicles So as Not to Startle Animals Being Ridden or Driven Upon Roads.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 29, § 997-A, additional. Title 29 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 997-A, to read as follows:

§ 997-A. No startling of animals

No motorist shall annoy, startle or harrass any animal being ridden or driven upon the road in any direction. He shall not sound his horn, cause his vehicle to backfire or cause any object to be waved or hurled from his vehicle in the direction of the animal.
