STATE OF MAINE SENATE 103rd LEGISLATURE

SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to H.P. 89, L.D. 186, Bill, "An Act Relating to Compensation and Allowances for Members of the Indian Tribes at the Legislature."

Amend said Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

'R.S., T. 3, § 2 amended. The last paragraph of section 2 of Title 3 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 342 of the public laws of 1965, is further amended to read as follows:

The member of the <u>Penobscot</u> Indian Tribe <u>and the member</u> of the <u>Passamaquoddy Indian Tribe</u> elected by-it to represent the <u>his</u> tribe at the biennial assembly of the Legislature shall receive a compensation of \$500 for such attendance, the same allowance as any other member of the Senate and House of Representatives and mileage for each day's attendance at the same rate per mile to and from his place of abode as state employees receive.'
