RESOLVE, Opening Millimagassett Lake, Penobscot County, to Ice Fishing.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, it is vitally necessary that the following legislation be passed to aid in the conservation of fishing, one of Maine's greatest natural resources; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Millimagassett Lake; opened to ice fishing. Resolved: That the Commissioner of Inland Fisheries and Game is authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Millimagassett Lake, T. 7 R. 8, W.E.L.S., Penobscot County to ice fishing.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.
