STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Prohibiting the Destruction of Political Posters and Signs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 17, § 2443, additional. Title 17 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 2443, to read as follows:

§ 2443. Destruction of political posters and signs

Whoever willfully or maliciously disturbs, removes, destroys or defaces any lawfully erected political sign or poster, advocating the candidacy of any political candidate, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both.
