AN ACT Providing for a Limited Open Season on Moose in Northern Zone.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 2355-B, additional. Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new section 2355-B, to read as follows:

§ 2355-B. Open season on moose

There shall be a 3-day annual open season on moose in the Northern Zone on the 2nd Monday, the 2nd Tuesday and the 2nd Wednesday of November. During the open season it shall be lawful for any licensed hunter to shoot and have in possession not more than one moose.

Moose killed shall be registered in the same manner as deer are registered under section 2355. At the time of registration, the person registering the moose, if a resident, shall pay the agent in charge of the registration station the sum of \$10.25, and if a nonresident, the sum of \$75.25, and the agent shall retain for himself 25¢ from each payment made.
