IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT Prohibiting Hauling Lobster Pots on Sundays.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 4458, amended. The first sentence of section 4458 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

From June 1st to October 31st of each year, it is unlawful for any person to raise, haul or transfer from the tidal waters of this State any pot, trap or other contrivance that is set for the taking of lobsters or crabs during the period $\frac{1}{2}$ hour after sunset until $\frac{1}{2}$ hour before sunrise of the following morning, **except that during June, July and August of each year, it is unlawful for any person to raise, haul or transfer from the tidal waters of this State any pot, trap or other contrivance that is set for the taking of lobsters or crabs during the period from 4:00 p.m., United States Daylight Saving Time, on Saturday to sunrise on the following Monday.**
