AN ACT to Limit Fishing Lobster Traps on Trawls in Certain Waters.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., T. 12, § 4465, amended. Section 4465 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended to read as follows:

§ 4465. —Certain tidal waters

It is unlawful to have on any trawl more than 3 lobster traps on one warp and buoy in that part of the tidal waters of the State ~~easterly from a line running true south from Pemaquid Point Light, Lincoln County, to a line true south from Owl's Head Light, Knox County~~ which is between the following 2 lines:

1. First line. Beginning at a point 48 miles true north of the lighthouse on Pemaquid Point, County of Lincoln and State of Maine; thence running true south through said lighthouse to a point where said line intersects the south-easterly boundary of the coastal waters within the jurisdiction of the State of Maine.

2. Second line. Beginning at a point 40 miles true north from the lighthouse at Robinson's Point, Isle au Haut, Knox County, Maine; thence running true south through said lighthouse to a point where said line intersects the south-easterly boundary of the coastal waters within the jurisdiction of the State of Maine.
