AN ACT Increasing Mileage Allowance for State Employees on State Business.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., T. 5, § 8, amended. Section 8 of Title 5 of the Revised Statutes is amended to read as follows:

§ 8. Mileage allowance

The State shall pay for the use of privately owned automobiles for travel by employees of the State in the business of the State not more than ~~90~~ **100** per mile for ~~the first 5,000~~ miles actually travelled by such employees on such business in any one fiscal year. ~~and 70 for each mile exceeding 5,000 miles, except that the State shall pay inspectors of seed potatoes or table stock potatoes 90 for every mile so travelled~~ The Governor, with the advice and consent of the Council, may suspend the operation of this section and require state officials and employees to travel in automobiles owned or controlled by the State, if such automobiles be available.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$25,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1968 and the sum of \$25,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1969 for carrying out the purpose of this Act.
