**AN ACT to Reestablish the Mount Bigelow Game Preserve.**

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., T. 12, § 2101, amended.** Section 2101 of Title 12 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by inserting in alphabetical order the following:

**Mount Bigelow Game Preserve:** The following described tracts or territory situated in Franklin and Somerset Counties, to wit: All that part of Jerusalem Township, Sugarloaf Township, formerly Crockertown, Wyman Township 4, Range 3, Coplin Plantation and the southeast corner of Eustis in Franklin County, and Township 4, Range 3 (Bigelow Plantation) and Township 3, Range 3 (Dead River Plantation) in the County of Somerset, which is within the following bounds: Beginning on southeasterly shore of Flagstaff Lake and the southeasterly corner of Township 3, Range 3 (Dead River Plantation) at a point nearest the junction of the highway now numbered 1134 with the highway numbered 306 leading southwesterly to Carrabasset and routes 16 and 27; thence southerly to said junction and generally southwesterly by said highway numbered 306 to said routes 16 and 27; thence generally westerly by said routes 16 and 27 to the Town of Stratton and to a point on the shore of Flagstaff Lake in the southeast corner of Eustis; thence generally easterly by the shore of said lake to the point of beginning.
